

- 1 ENTER URL IN SEARCH ENGINE
 https://seedschool.powerschool.com/public/
- 2 CLICK "CREATE AN ACCOUNT"
- GUARDIAN'S NAME & EMAIL

 Enter your first & last names and email address in the designated fields.
- 4 CREATE A PASS WORD
 Enter a password of your choosing at least 6 characters.
- 5 RE-ENTER PASSWORD
 Enter the password, again.
- 6 Student's name must be entered exactly as it appears in PowerSchool. If you have multiple children @ SEED DC, each will have their own access ID & access password.
- 7 ENTER ACCESS CONFIDENTIAL ID
 This is provided by the school.
- 8 ENTER ACCESS PASSWORD
 This is provided by the school
- 9 RELATIONSHIP TO STUDENT
 Select the option which indicates your relationship to the student
- ADDITIONAL CHILDREN?

 Follow steps 6-9 if you have more than one scholar at the school.
